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# safety and usage information

# Keep your phone away from small children and pets

Keep your phone and all accessories out of the reach of small children or animals. Small parts may cause choking or serious injury if swallowed.

### Protect your hearing



Listening to a headset at high volumes can damage your hearing. Use only the minimum volume setting necessary to hear your conversation or music.

# Install mobile phones and equipment with caution



If you have any reason to suspect that your phone is interfering with a pacemaker or other medical device, turn off the phone immediately and contact the manufacturer of the pacemaker or medical device for guidance.

# Turn off the phone in potentially explosive environments

Do not use your phone at refuelling points (service stations) or near fuels or chemicals. Turn off your phone whenever directed by warning signs or instructions. Your phone could cause explosions or fire in and around fuel or chemical storage and transfer areas or blasting areas. Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the phone, its parts, or accessories.

# Reduce the risk of repetitive motion injuries

# Handle your phone carefully and sensibly


 Your phone has been tested in a controlled environment and shown to be dust and water resistant in certain circumstances (meets requirements of classification IP57 as described by the international standard IEC 60529 - Degrees of Protection provided by Enclosures [IP Code]; test conditions: 15~35° C, 86~106kPa, 1meter, for 30minutes). Despite this classification, your phone is not impervious to water damage in any situation.

- Improperly sealed covers, extended immersion in water, and/or excessive pressure may cause leaks and allow water to enter the phone. Do not intensionally immerse the phone in water, allow the phone to come in contact with water, or expose it to humidity.
- Improper sealing of covers, eccessive exposure to dust and/or excessive pressure may cause dust penetration. Do not expose to dust and/or sand for extended periods of time.
- Your phone is a complex electronic device. Protect it from impact and rough handling to avoid serious damage. Damage to the phone's exterior may reduce its protection against water damage. Do not insert sharp objects into the speaker holes, microphone holes, or receiver holes, as this may puncture the protective surface and allow water and dust to enter.



### Phone layout

The front of your phone includes the following keys and features:



The rear of your phone includes the following keys and features:





You can lock the keys to prevent any unwanted phone operations. To lock the keys, press and hold [\*]. To unlock these keys, press and hold [\*].

When the auto keypad lock is on, the keys will be locked automatically after the display turns off.

# Maintain your water and dust resistant feature

Your phone offers limited protection against accidental exposure to water in some conditions, but you should never intensionally immerse the phone in water.

• Do not expose your phone to high water pressures or any other liquids, such as salt water, ionized water or dirty water.



• If the phone gets wet, dry it thoroughly with a clean soft cloth.



• Ensure that all covers are properly aligned and tightly closed.



- Always keep the multifunction jack cover clean and be careful to avoid damaging it.
- Any service performed on the phone may reduce the water and dust protection. Avoid exposing the phone to dust and water if any service has been performed on it.



# assembling and preparing your mobile phone


Get started by assembling and setting up your mobile phone for its first use.

### Install the SIM card and battery

When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a Subscriber Identity Module, or SIM card, with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services.

To install the SIM card and battery,

1. Unscrew the lock and remove the battery cover.





Do not use your fingernails to unscrew. Use a coin or screw driver, instead.



If the phone is on, press and hold [••••] to turn it off.


### 2. Insert the SIM card.



Place the SIM card in the phone with the goldcoloured contacts facing down. 3. Insert the battery.



4. Replace the battery cover and screw the lock.





Screw the lock completely to secure the battery cover. The battery cover must be closed tightly to avoid water damage.

### Charge the battery

Before using the phone for the first time, you must charge the battery.

1. Open the cover to the multifunction jack and plug the small end of the travel adapter.





Improperly connecting the travel adapter can cause serious damage to the phone. Any damages by misuse are not covered by the warranty.

- 2. Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.
- When the battery is fully charged (the minimized is no longer moving), unplug the travel adapter from the power outlet.
- 4. Unplug the travel adapter from the phone.
- 5. Close the cover to the multifunction jack.



Push the cover completely to secure the multifunction jack. The multifunction jack must be closed tightly to avoid water damage.



#### About the low battery indicator

When your battery is low, the phone will emit a warning tone and a low battery message. The battery icon will also be empty and blinking. If the battery level becomes too low, the phone will automatically power off. Recharge your battery to continue using your phone.

### Insert a memory card (optional)

To store additional multimedia files, you must insert a memory card. Your phone accepts microSD™ memory cards up to 8 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).


- 1. Unscrew the lock and remove the battery cover.
- 2. Remove the battery.
- 3. Unlock the memory card cover.

- 4. Lift the memory card cover and insert a memory card with the label side facing up.
- 5. Close and lock the memory card cover.

- 6. Insert the battery.
- 7. Replace the battery cover and screw the lock.







# using basic functions

Learn how to perform basic operations and use the main features of your mobile phone.

### Turn your phone on and off

To turn your phone on,

- 1. Press and hold [---].
- 2. Enter your PIN and press <**Confirm**> (if necessary).
- 3. When the setup wizard opens, customise your phone as desired by following the screen.

To turn your phone off, repeat step 1 above.

### Switch to the Offline profile

By switching to the **Offline** profile, you can use your phone's non-network services in areas where wireless devices are prohibited, such as aeroplane and hospitals.

To switch to the **Offline** profile, in Menu mode, select **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Phone profiles**  $\rightarrow$  **Offline**.



Follow all posted warnings and directions from official personnel when in areas where wireless devices are prohibited.

### Access menus

To access your phone's menus,

- 1. In Idle mode, press < Menu> to access Menu mode.
- 2. Use the navigation key to scroll to a menu or option.
- 3. Press the Confirm key, <**Select**>, or <**OK**> to confirm the highlighted option.
- 4. Press <**Back**> to move up one level; Press [••••] to return to Idle mode.

### Customise your phone

Get more from your phone by customising it to match your preferences.

### Adjust the volume of the key tones

In Idle mode, press  $\left[\begin{smallmatrix} {}_{\blacktriangle} \, / \, \gamma \, \right]$  to adjust the key tone volume.

### Switch to or from the Silent profile

In Idle mode, press and hold [#] to silence or unsilence your phone.

### Change your ringtone

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone profiles.
- 2. Scroll to the profile you are using.
- 3. Press  $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow Edit \rightarrow Voice call ringtone.$

4. Select a ringtone category  $\rightarrow$  a ringtone.

Press <Save>.

To switch to another profile, select it from the list.

### Create a phone profile

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone profiles.
- 2. Press <Options $> \rightarrow$  Create.
- 3. Enter a name for the profile and press the Confirm key.
- 4. Customise the sound settings as desired.
- 5. When you have finished, press <Save>.

### Select a wallpaper (Idle mode)

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display and light → Home screen.
- 2. Scroll left or right to Images.

- 3. Select **Wallpaper**  $\rightarrow$  an image.
- 4. Press <Save>.

### Select a skin colour (Menu mode)

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display and light → My theme.
- 2. Select a colour pattern.

### Set menu shortcuts

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone settings → Shortcuts.
- 2. Select a key to use as a shortcut.
- 3. Select a menu to assign to the shortcut key.

### Lock your phone

- 1. In Menu mode, select Settings  $\rightarrow$  Security  $\rightarrow$  Phone lock  $\rightarrow$  On.
- 2. Enter a new 4- to 8-digit password and press <**OK**>.
- 3. Enter the new password again and press <OK>.

### Use basic call functions

Learn to make or answer calls and use basic call functions.

### Make a call

- 1. In Idle mode, enter an area code and a phone number.
- 2. Press [----] to dial the number.
- 3. To end the call, press [----].

### Answer a call

- 1. When a call comes in, press [----].
- 2. To end the call, press [-.

### Adjust the volume

To adjust the volume during a call, press [  ${\scriptstyle \blacktriangle}$  /  ${\scriptstyle \blacktriangledown}$  ].

### Use the speakerphone feature

- 1. During a call, press the Confirm key to activate the speaker.
- 2. To switch back to the earpiece, press the Confirm key again.

### Use the headset

By plugging the supplied headset into the multifunction jack, you can make and answer calls:

- To redial the last call, press the headset button, and then press again and hold.
- To answer a call, press and hold the headset button.
- To end a call, press and hold the headset button.

### Send and view messages

Learn to send or view text (SMS), multimedia (MMS), or email messages.

### Send a text or multimedia message

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Create new message → Message.
- 2. Enter a destination number and scroll down.

- Enter your message text. ► Enter text For sending as a text message, skip to step 7. For attaching multimedia, continue with step 4.
- Press <Options> → Add multimedia and add an item.
- 5. Press <Options $> \rightarrow$  Advanced  $\rightarrow$  Add subject.
- 6. Enter a subject.
- 7. Press  $\langle \text{Options} \rangle \rightarrow \text{Send}$  to send the message.

### Send an email

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Create new message → Email.
- 2. Enter an email address and scroll down.
- 3. Enter a subject and scroll down.
- 4. Enter your email text.

- Press <Options> → Attach multimedia and attach a file (if necessary).
- 6. Press  $\langle \text{Options} \rangle \rightarrow \text{Send}$  to send the message.

### Enter text

When entering text, you can change the text input mode:

- Press and hold [\*] to switch between T9 and ABC modes.
- Press [\*] to change case or switch to Number mode.
- Press and hold [#] to switch to Symbol mode.

Enter text in one of the following modes:

Mode	Function
ABC	Press the appropriate alphanumeric key until the character you want appears on the display.
Т9	<ol> <li>Press the appropriate alphanumeric keys to enter an entire word.</li> <li>When the word displays correctly, press [#] to insert a space. If the correct word does not display, select an alternate word from the list that appears.</li> </ol>
Number	Press the appropriate alphanumeric key to enter a number.

### View text or multimedia messages

- In Menu mode, select Messages → My messages → Inbox.
- 2. Select a text or multimedia message.

### View an email

- In Menu mode, select Messages → My messages → Email inbox.
- 2. Select an account.
- 3. Select Check new email.
- 4. Select an email or a header.
- 5. If you selected a header, press <Options $> \rightarrow$  Retrieve to view the body of the email.

### Add and find contacts

Learn the basics of using the Phonebook feature.

### Add a new contact

- 1. In Idle mode, enter a phone number and press <**Options**>.
- 2. Select **Save**  $\rightarrow$  a memory location (phone or SIM)  $\rightarrow$  **New**.
- 3. Select a number type (if necessary).
- 4. Enter contact information.
- Press the Confirm key or press <**Options**> → Save to add the contact to memory.

### Find a contact

- 1. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- 2. Enter the first few letters of the name you want to find.

Select the contact's name from the search list.



- Once you have found a contact, you can:
- call the contact by pressing [----]
- edit the contact information by pressing  $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow Edit$

### Use basic camera functions

Learn the basics to capture and view photos and videos

### Capture photos

- 1. In Menu mode, select Camera to turn on the camera.
- 2. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.

- Press the Confirm key to take a photo. The photo is saved automatically.
- 4. Press <**Back**> to take another photo (step 2).

### View photos

In Menu mode, select My files  $\rightarrow$  Images  $\rightarrow$  My photos → a photo file.

### Capture videos

- 1. In Menu mode, select Camera to turn on the camera.
- 2. Press [1] to switch to Recording mode.
- 3. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
- 4. Press the Confirm key to start recording.
- 5. Press the Confirm key or <■> to stop recording. The video is saved automatically.
- 6. Press  $< \pm >$  to record another video (step 3).

### View videos

In Menu mode, select My files  $\rightarrow$  Videos  $\rightarrow$  My video clips  $\rightarrow$  a video file.

### Listen to music

Learn how to listen to music via the music player or FM radio.

### Listen to the FM radio

- 1. Plug the supplied headset into the phone's multifunction jack.
- 2. In Menu mode, select FM radio.
- 3. Press the Confirm key to turn on the FM radio.
- Press < Yes> to start automatic tuning. The radio scans and saves available stations automatically.



The first time you access **FM radio**, you will be prompted to start automatic tuning.

- 5. Scroll up or down to a radio station.
- 6. To turn off the FM radio, press the Confirm key.

### Listen to music files

Start by transferring files to your phone or memory card:

- Download from the wireless web. ▶ p. 30
- Download from a PC with the optional Samsung PC Studio. ▶ p. 37
- Receive via Bluetooth. ▶ p. 41
- Copy to your memory card. ► p. 38

After transferring music files to your phone or memory card,

- 1. In Menu mode, select Music.
- 2. Select a music category  $\rightarrow$  a music file.



- 3. Enter a page title and a web address (URL).
- 4. Press the Confirm key.



# using advanced functions

Learn how to perform advanced operations and use additional features of your mobile phone.

#### Use advanced call functions

Learn about your phone's additional calling capabilities.

#### View and dial missed calls

Your phone will display calls you have missed on the display. To dial the number of a missed call,

- 1. Press <View>.
- 2. Scroll to the missed call you want to dial.
- 3. Press [-] to dial.

#### Call a recently dialled number

- In Idle mode, press [-] to display a list of recent numbers.
- 2. Scroll to the number you want and press [---] to dial.

#### Hold a call or retrieve a held call

Press <**Hold**> to place a call on hold or press <**Retrieve**> to retrieve a held call.

#### Dial a second call

If your network supports this function, you can dial another number during a call:

- 1. Press <Hold> to place the first call on hold.
- Enter the second number to dial and press [-].
- 3. Press <Swap> to switch between the two calls.
- 4. To end the call on hold, press <Options>  $\rightarrow$  End  $\rightarrow$  Held call.
- 5. To end the current call, press [----].

#### Answer a second call

If your network supports this function, you can answer a second incoming call:

- Press [---] to answer the second call. The first call is automatically placed on hold.
- 2. Press <Swap> to switch between the calls.

#### Make a multiparty call (conference call)

- 1. Call the first party you want to add to the multiparty call.
- While connected to the first party, call the second party. The first party is automatically placed on hold.
- 3. When connected to the second party, press  $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow Conference call.$

- Repeat steps 2 and 3 to add more parties (if necessary).
- 5. To end the multiparty call, press [----].

#### Call an international number

- 1. In Idle mode, press and hold [0] to insert the + character.
- Enter the complete number you want to dial (country code, area code, and phone number), and then press [-] to dial.

#### Call a contact from Phonebook

You can call numbers directly from Phonebook using stored contacts.  $\blacktriangleright$  p. 27

- 1. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- Scroll to the number you want to dial and press
   [---] to dial.

#### Use advanced Phonebook functions

Learn to create namecards, set speed dial numbers, and create groups of contacts.

#### Create a namecard

- 1. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- 2. Press  $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow My$  namecard.
- 3. Enter your personal details, and press the Confirm key or press <**Options**> → **Save**.



You can send your namecard by attaching it to a message or email or transferring it via the Bluetooth wireless feature.

#### Set speed dial numbers

- 1. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- 2. Scroll to a contact to assign.
- 3. Press  $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow Add$  to speed dial.
- 4. Select a number (if necessary).
- 5. Scroll to a number you want to set (2-9) and press < Add>.

The contact is saved to the speed dial number.



You can now call this contact from Idle mode by pressing and holding the assigned speed dial number.

#### Create a group of contacts

By creating groups of contacts, you can assign ringtones and caller ID photos to each group or send messages and emails to an entire group. Start by creating a group:

   When connected, a pop-up window will appear on the PC.

- 4. Open Windows Media Player to synchronise music files.
- 5. Edit or enter your phone's name in the pop-up window (if necessary).
- 6. Select and drag the music files you want to the sync list.
- 7. Click Start Sync.

#### Copy music files to a memory card

- 1. Insert a memory card.

- Using an optional PC data cable, connect the multifunction jack on your phone to a PC.
   When connected, a pop-up window will appear on the PC.

- 8. Enter a new file name for the image, and press  $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow Save$ .

#### Insert a visual feature

- When you are finished with adding visual features, press <Options> → Save as → <Yes>.

#### View world clocks

Learn to view the time in another country or city and set world clocks to appear on your display.

#### View a world clock

- In Menu mode, select Organiser → World clock.
- 2. Scroll down to the middle clock.
- 3. Scroll left or right to a time zone.
- 4. Scroll down to the bottom clock.
- 5. Scroll left or right to a time zone.
- 6. Press the Confirm key to save your world clock.



- To set daylight saving time, press < Options>

- 2. Press the Confirm key to begin and record lap times.
- 3. When you are finished, press <Stop>.

4. Press < Reset> to clear recorded times.

#### Create a new task

- 1. In Menu mode, select Organiser  $\rightarrow$  Task.
- 2. Press < Create>.
- 3. Enter the details of the task.
- 4. Press <Save>, or press <Options $> \rightarrow$  Save.

#### Create a text memo

- 1. In Menu mode, select Organiser  $\rightarrow$  Memo.
- 2. Press < Create>.
- 3. Enter your memo text.
- 4. Press <Options $> \rightarrow$  Save.

#### Manage your calendar

Learn to change the calendar view and create events.

#### Change the calendar view

- 1. In Menu mode, select **Organiser**  $\rightarrow$  **Calendar**.
- 2. Press  $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow View by \rightarrow Day or Week$ .

#### Create an event

- 1. In Menu mode, select Organiser  $\rightarrow$  Calendar.

# troubleshooting

If you are having trouble with your mobile phone, try these troubleshooting procedures before contacting a service professional.

### While using your phone, the following messages may appear:

Try this to solve the problem:

When uping the phone for the first time

### Your phone displays "Network error" or "No network."

- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.
- You cannot access some options without a subscription. Contact your service provider for more details.

#### You enter a number, but the call is not dialled.

- Ensure that you have pressed the Dial key: [---].
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the phone number.

#### Another caller cannot reach you.

- Ensure that your phone is turned on.
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the phone number.

#### Another caller cannot hear you speaking.

- Ensure that you are not covering the built-in microphone.
- Ensure that the microphone is close to your mouth.
- If using a headset, ensure that it is properly connected.

#### The phone beeps and the battery icon flashes.

Your battery is low. Recharge or replace the battery to continue using the phone.

#### The audio quality of the call is poor.

- Ensure that you are not blocking the phone's internal antenna.
- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.

### You select a contact to call, but the call is not dialled.

- Ensure that the correct number is stored in the contact list.
- Re-enter and save the number, if necessary.

### The battery does not charge properly or sometimes the phone turns itself off.

 The battery terminals may be dirty. Wipe both gold-coloured contacts with a clean, soft cloth and try charging the battery again.  If the battery will no longer charge completely, dispose of the old battery properly and replace it with a new battery.

#### Your phone is hot to the touch.

When you use several applications at once, your phone requires more power and may heat up.

This is normal and should not affect your phone's lifespan or performance.
